

Maths

Number Sense

We will continue learning to count in twos, fives and tens, and use the language of equal to, more than, less than (fewer), most, least.

Additive Reasoning

We will read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition (+), subtraction (−) and equals (=) signs.

Multiplicative Reasoning

Pupils can represent and explain what happens when doubling and halving.

Geometric Reasoning

Pupils will develop their understanding of halves and quarters.

English

Fantasy World Stories

The children will explore different fantasy worlds, the characters who might live in them, the objects they use and possible adventures. We will complete the unit by writing our own stories.

Information Texts

The children will gain experience of posing and answering questions, exploring how to use alphabetical order, index and glossaries. They will explore information texts, producing their own page for an information book.

Poetry: Poems on a theme –Seaside

Children will listen to poems, look at pictures and explore props to help them consider how they feel and view the seaside. They will begin to develop their ability to discuss the language of poetry.

PE

Sports Development

The children will be introduced to circuits and athletics this term and we will participate in the KS1 Sports Day.

Games

Children will develop basic game-playing skills, in particular throwing, catching and dodging skills. They have the opportunity to play one against one, one against two, and one against three.

Around Our School-the local area

We will move onto our new topic, *Around our school*, focusing on aspects of local amenities, land use and environment. The children will be introduced to maps, locating features such as our school, local parks and other landmarks.

The children will undertake their own research into our four house families-Greg, Egerton, Stamford and Legh, looking at the history of the families and their impact on the local area.



Science

Plants The children will learn about the structure of plants and trees and what they need to grow well. Children engage in a variety of activities including identifying common plants and trees in the garden and in the wild and sorting deciduous and evergreen leaves. Children will plant their own seed in lesson 1 and observe it closely over the coming weeks by measuring and recording its growth.

Seasonal changes - Spring and Summer

The children will be learning about and observing signs of spring and summer. They will be making close observations of nature and wildlife and will also be studying the differences in weather that we experience at this time of year. They will be collecting data outside and analysing and discussing it.

E-safety

The children learn about the risks of using the internet and how to keep safe. We will look at how to search the internet safely, what information should and shouldn't be shared online and sending emails to each other.
