At the end of a very busy half term, it's a great time to look back on some of the fantastic experiences that the pupils have been enjoying over the last six weeks.

The weather definitely hasn't stopped the pupils getting out and about since Christmas. Year 1 and Year 2 have been undertaking outdoor and adventurous activities on the field, working with Grip Adventure. Sale Sharks Rugby coaches have been working with our younger pupils during the school day and after school and the Reception class has been on a local walk to learn about our local area.

Since September, the school has been focussing on re-establishing links with the local community. One of our community partners, Altrincham Football Club, come to Elmridge every Thursday to coach girls' football. I was at Moss Lane, on Saturday, watching Altrincham play. After a bad run of results, the team came from 2-0 down to get a 2-2 draw against Woking. Despite the cold, wet, weather, it was great afternoon out and it was lovely to see some Elmridge pupils at the game. It reminded me that we have some great local sport on our doorstep that we can take advantage of without the need to travel further afield.

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Outdoor Learning

At Elmridge this term there is a strong focus on developing outdoor learning. The school has begun working with Grip Adventure, a local organisation- based in sale- which specialises in outdoor pursuits and adventurous activities. Since the beginning of January, Grip have worked with Year 1 and Year 2 for a morning or afternoon a week. The children have been den building, making popcorn, building dream catcher nets and taking part in scavenger hunts. They have relished the experiences and have been lucky enough to enjoy from some dry weather apart from the first week which brought the typical January biting cold and rain. The school's relationship with Grip will continue after half term with Key Stage Two pupils participating in adventure days off the premises, involving pursuits such as climbing and bushcraft. Whilst Grip Adventure has worked with whole classes of pupils, Sam Wood- Nursery HLTA has begun to work on some innovative outdoor learning projects with smaller groups across school. It has been great to see the pupils outside, appreciating the fresh air and making the most of the school grounds at a time of year when they are often restricted to working indoors.

RAF & Smallpeice

Year 5 & Year 6 took part in the RAF and Smallpeice space Challenge today. Pupils became RAF engineers and were asked to build and test a rocket.

They investigated the optimum launch angle and also how payload and fins impact a rockets performance.

This was a live virtual workshop and the children represented the school brilliantly as well as developing scientific knowledge, an understanding of careers and applying their maths skills.
